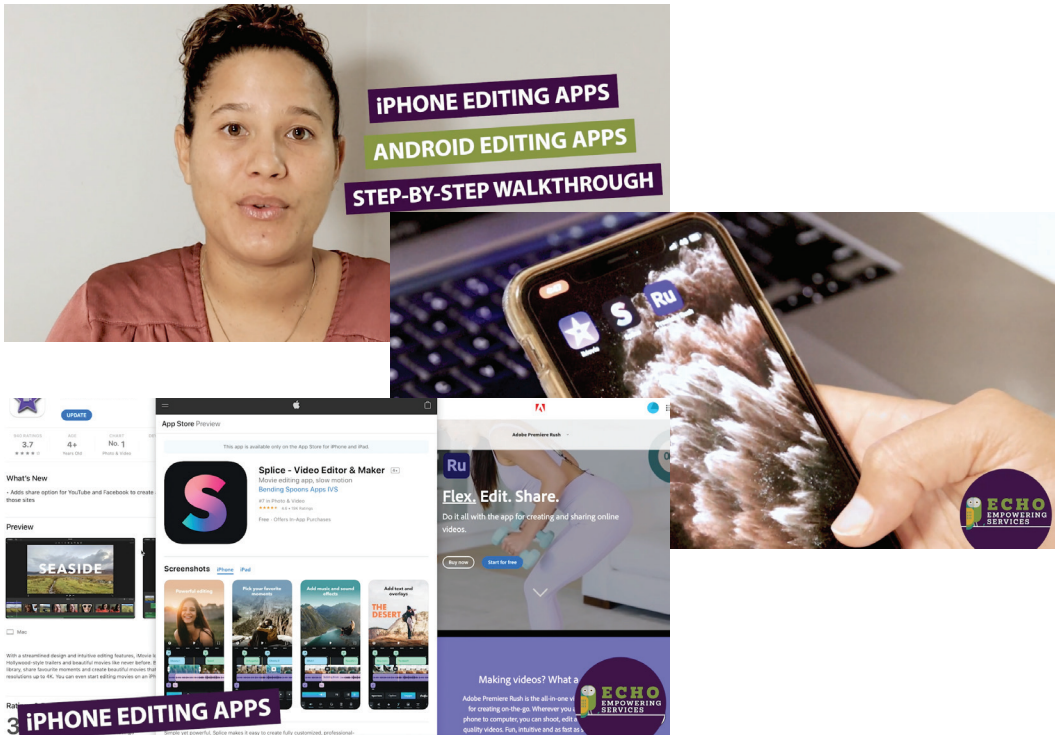


VIDEO: HOW TO EASILY EDIT VIDEOS ON YOUR SMARTPHONE! CHEAT SHEET



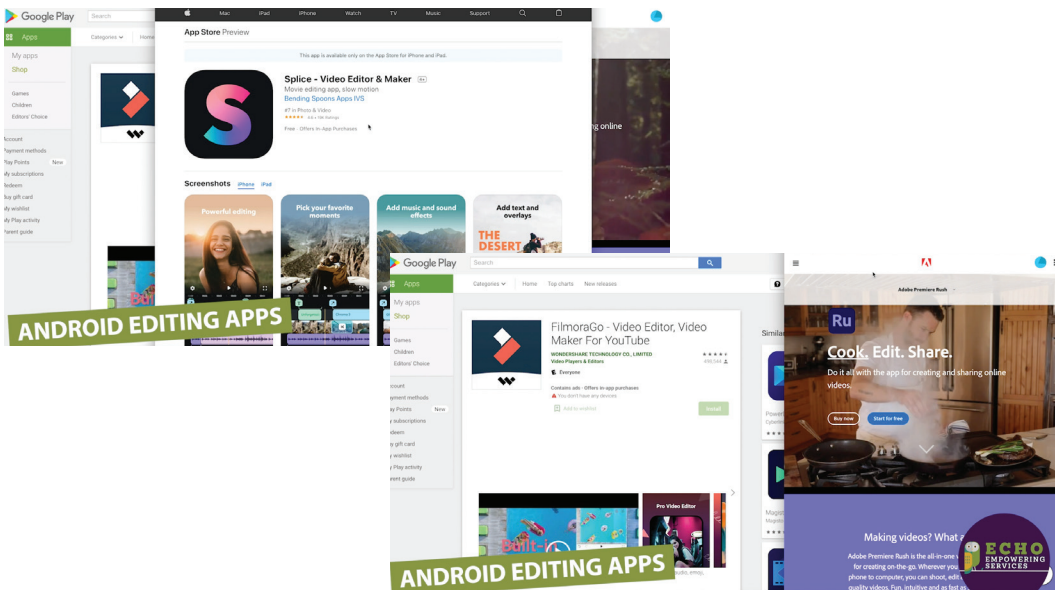
iPHONE/iPAD APPS

- iMovie**
- Free App that comes pre-loaded on your iPhone or iPad.
 - Exclusive to Apple products
 - Very basic level editing with colour adjustments, transitions and the ability to add sound and music.
- Splice**
- Free App (with in app purchases)
 - Available on both Apple and Android devices
 - Very intuitive and easy to use - can export in HD
- Adobe Premiere Rush**
- Premium App that comes as part of the Adobe Creative Suite Subscription.
 - Professional editing suite with lots of features and tools.



ANDROID APPS

- Filmora Go**
- Free App (with in app purchases)
 - Exclusive to Android devices
 - Easy to use and allows you have a lot of editing control.
- Splice**
- Free App (with in app purchases)
 - Available on both Apple and Android devices
 - Very intuitive and easy to use - can export in HD
- Adobe Premiere Rush**

EDITING USING SPLICE

1. Download Splice App from App Store or Google Play
2. Open Splice App and allow it to access your videos and photos
3. Select the videos you'd like to edit
4. Name your video
5. Select the video orientation (ie: Portrait or Landscape)
6. Cut videos using the slice tool. Click on the video in the timeline and options will appear.
7. Edit colour grading, brightness and contract by clicking on the video in the timeline and then filtering through the available options.
8. Add more videos to your timeline by selecting "media".
9. Add audio or music to your video by selecting "music".
10. Add a title, by slecting the "text" button.
11. Add transitions by clicking on the existing transition between your shots and transition options will appear.
12. Once you're ready to export, click the arrow button in the top right hand section of your screen and choose an export option.

- Export Tip:**
- It's best to export in Full HD - 1080p unless you filmed your video in Ultra 4K. Full HD - 1080p will be high enough for you to upload to platforms such as YouTube and Facebook.
